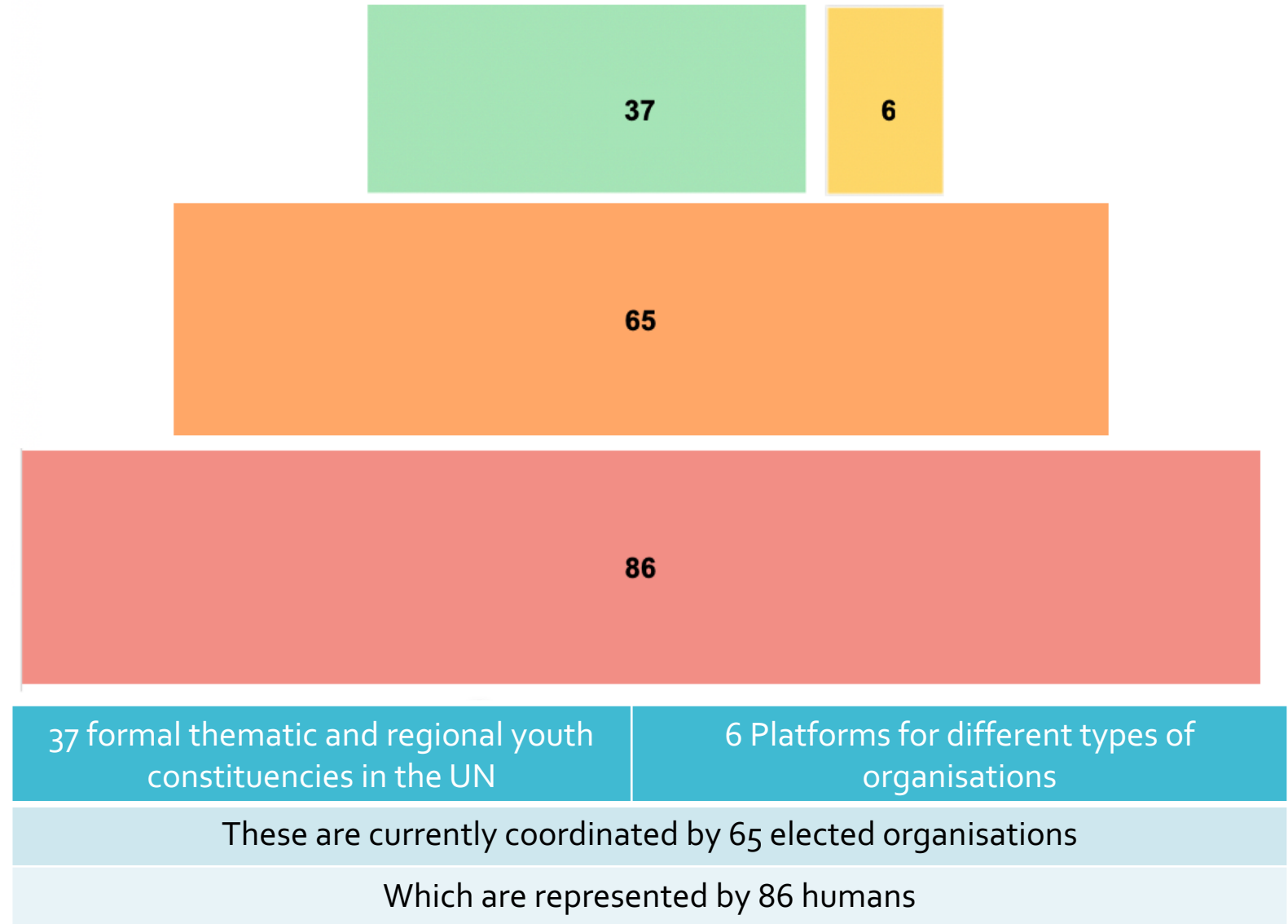
How Diverse is the UN MGCY Coordination Team



What is the Global Coordination Team ?

- It is the primary coordination structure of the UN MGCY
- Its role is to execute and create greater cohesion, coherence and coordination across all of UN MGCY's work, substantive, institutional and political.
- It comprises the Secretariat (OPs, Policy Officers*, and Administrative Officer), all the Global Focal Points, Focal Points of / Coordinators of Platforms, the Regional Caucus Coordinators and representative/s of the CYI Board of Trustees

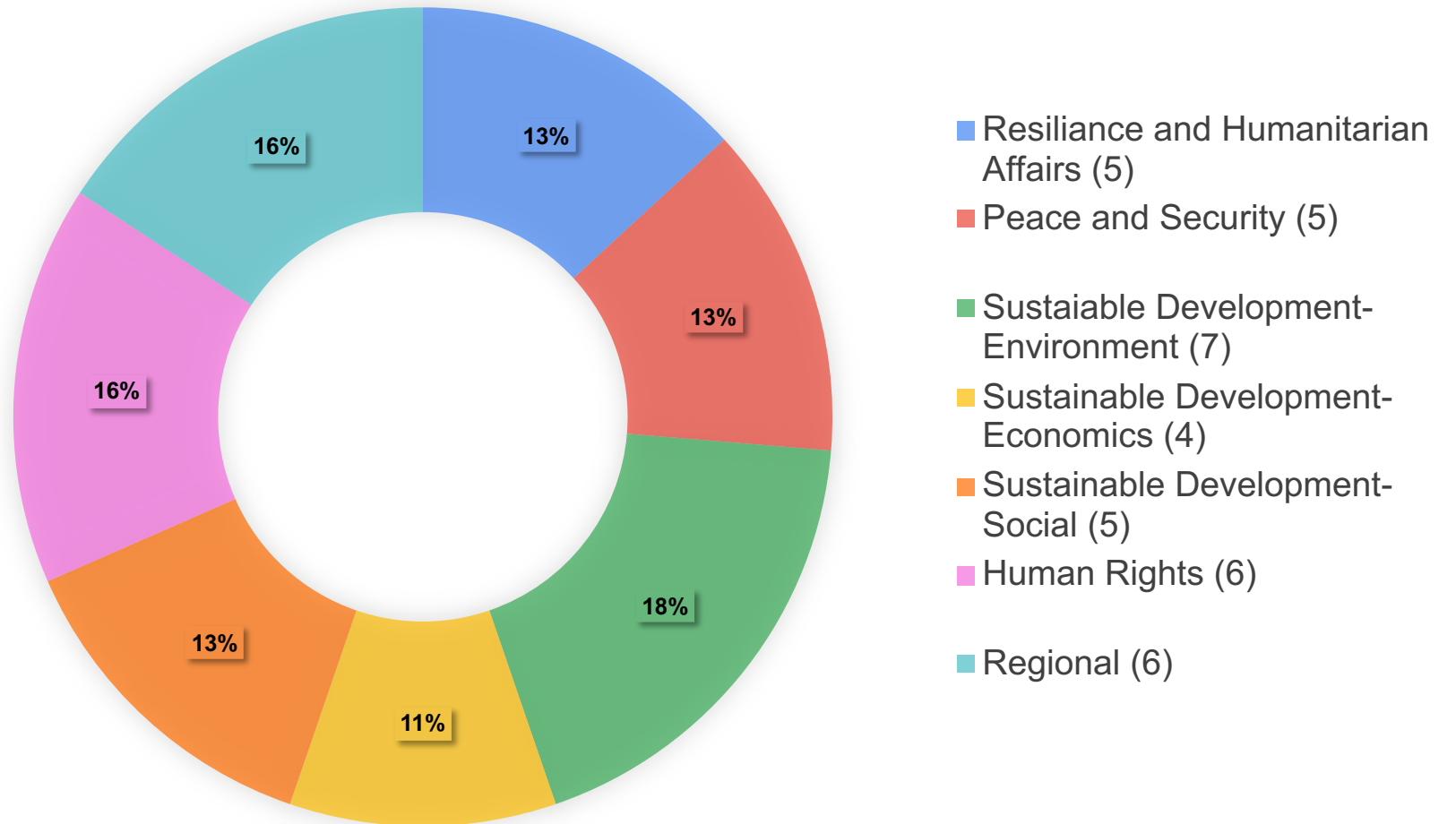


Recap of Concepts

- What is a Youth Constituency?
 - It is the formal engagement mechanism for young people for a specific topic/s and/or region/s in the UN
 - It has Obligatory Open Membership Policies and Reporting Requirements to the UN
 - Created through resolution and/or agreements with UN partners
 - Open to all formal and informal youth entities
 - All members have equal standing
 - Open to individual young people
 - Minimal to no approval process to become a member
- What is a Platform?
 - A crosscutting structure created to serve as a dedicated space/mechanism for specific types of groups in the context of the UN
 - Open membership policies for those that identify as the focus belonging to those groups

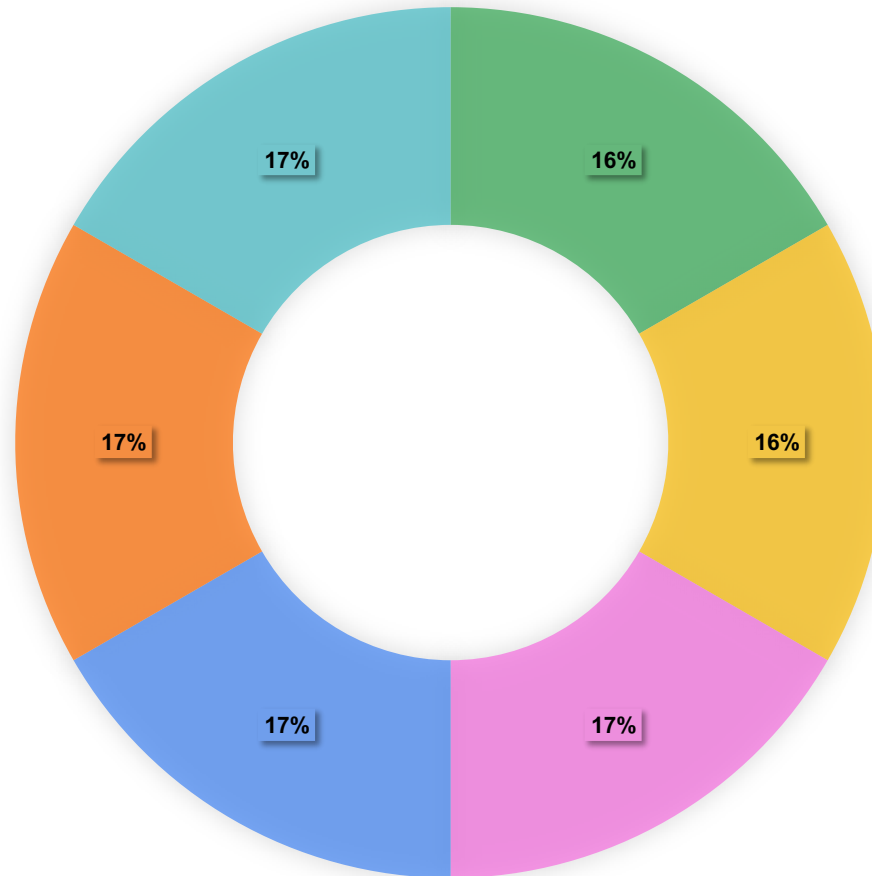

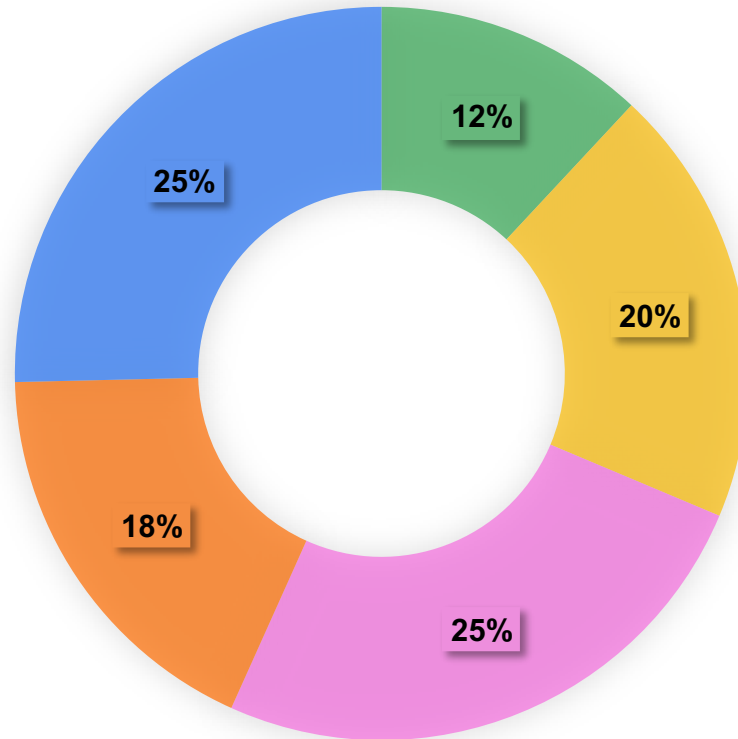

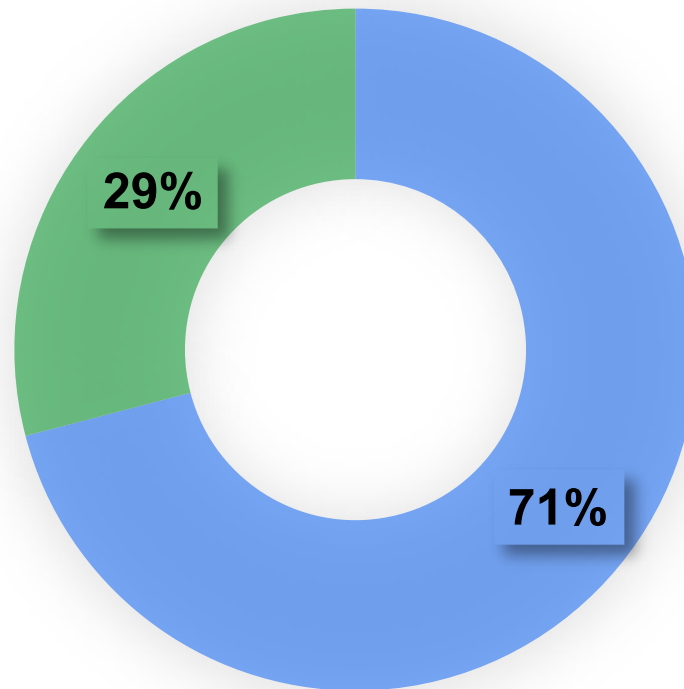

Distribution of People from Low/Middle Income Countries and High Income Countries



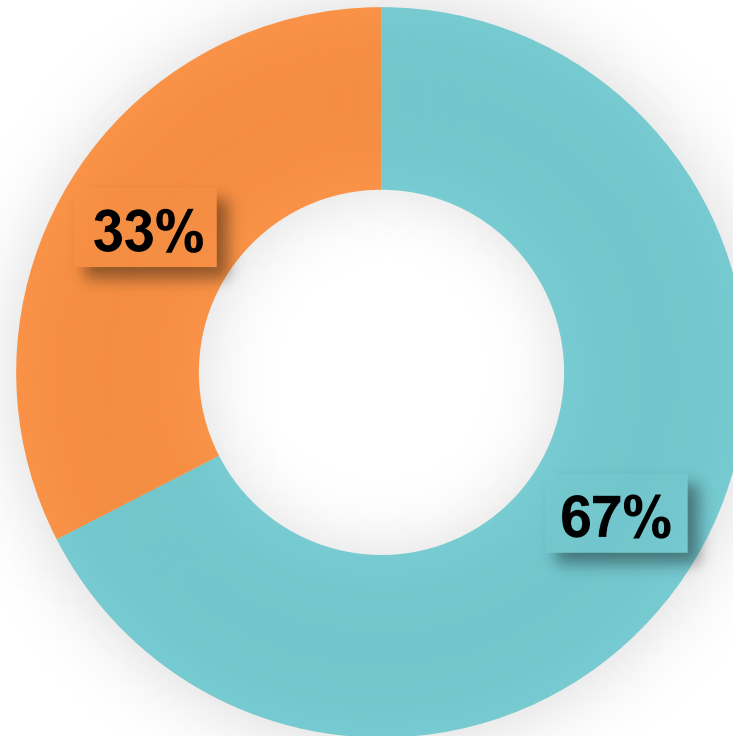
■ Low and Middle Income Countries (61)

Total Gender Distribution



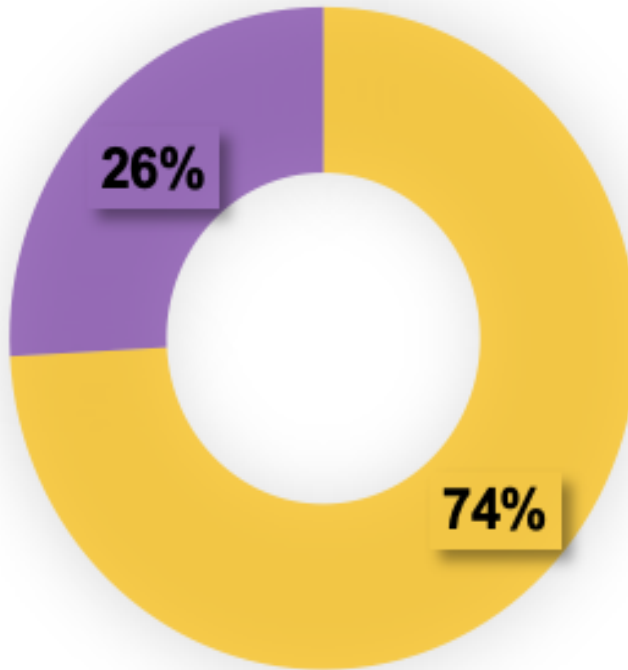
■ Females (58)

Distribution of Females from Low Income Countries/High Income Countries

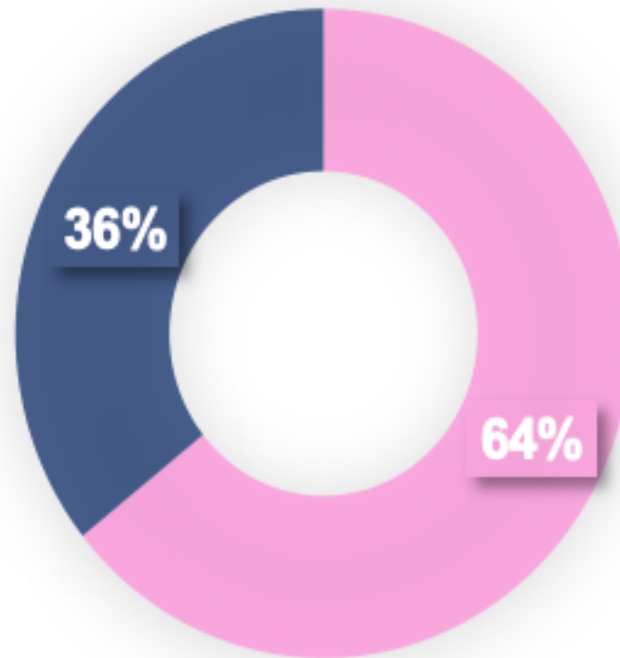


- Females from Low/Middle Income Countries (43)

- **74 %** of all women on the CT are from LMICs

Distribution of Those that Identify as Male

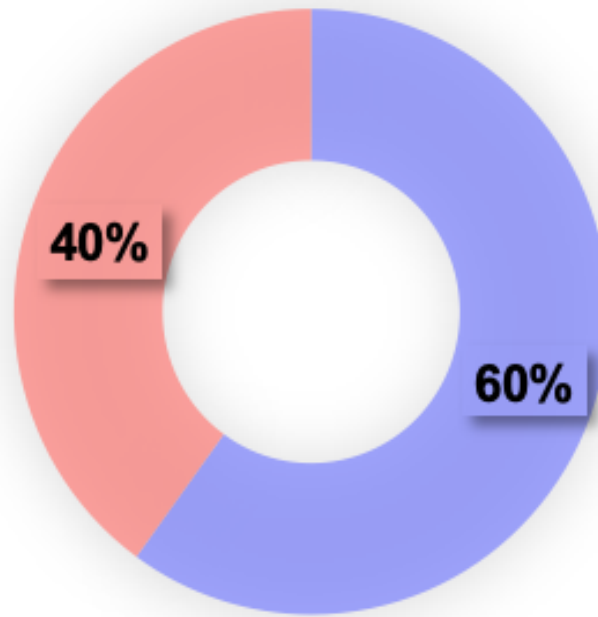
Distribution of Males from Low Income Countries/High Income Countries



- Males from Low/Middle Income Countries (18)
- Males from High Income Countries (10)
- **12 %** of the entire CT are men from high income countries
- **36%** of all men on the CT are from high income countries and **64 %** from LMICs

Distribution Within High Income Countries

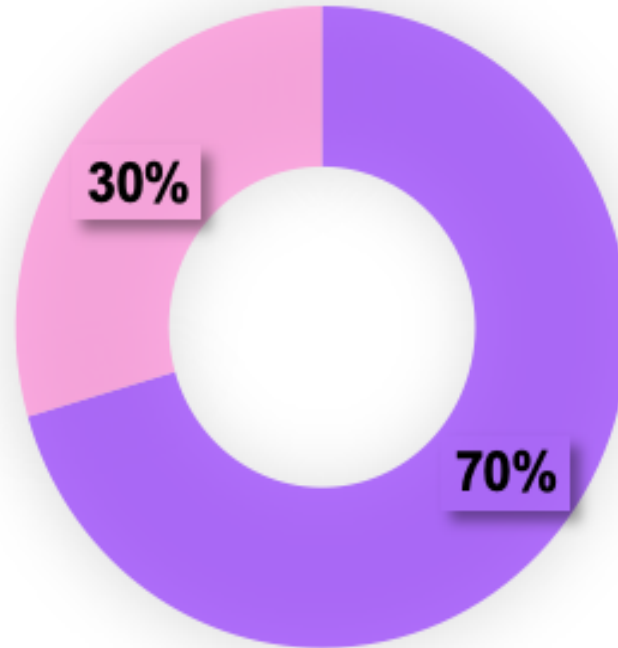
Gender Distribution from High Income Countries

Distribution Within Low & Middle Income Countries

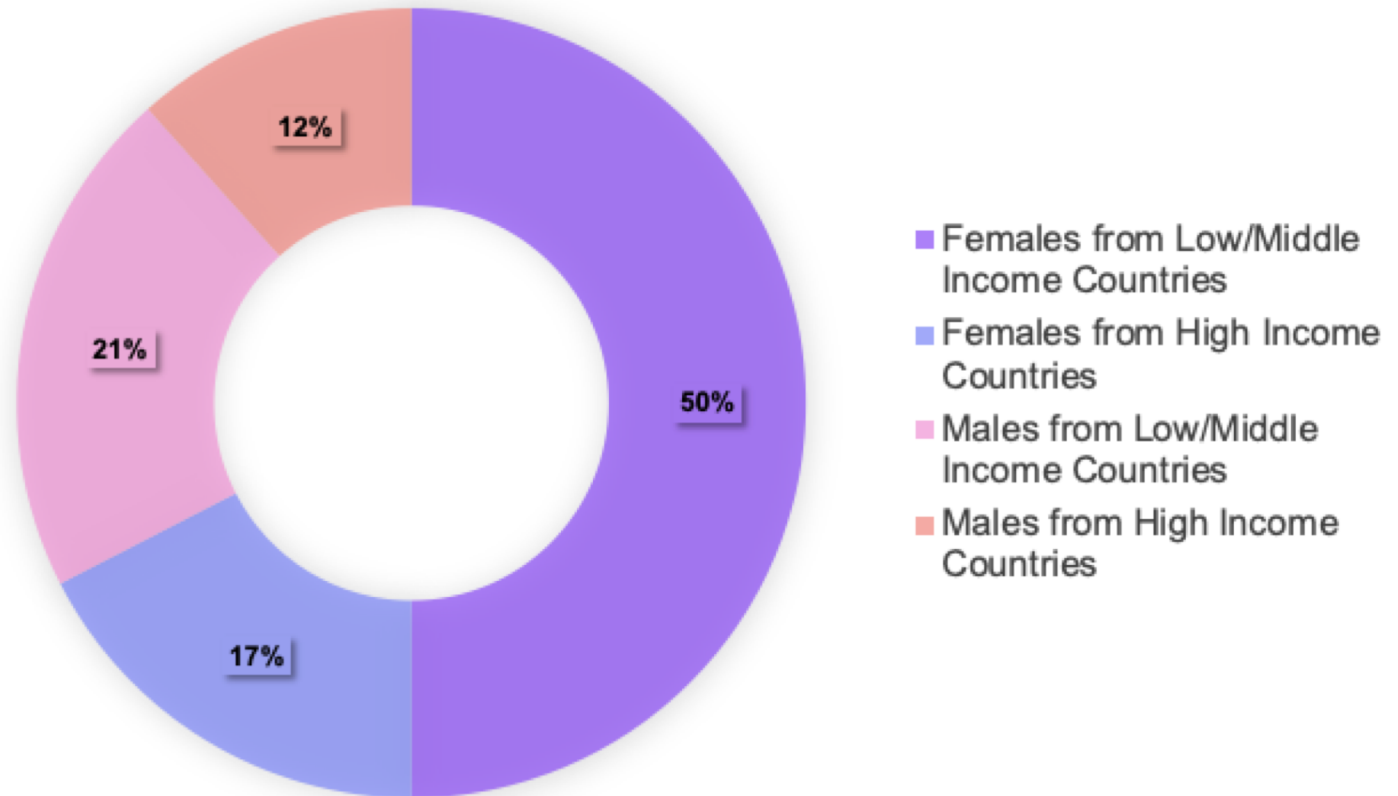
Gender Distribution from Low/Middle Income Countries

Combining the Previous 6 Doughnuts

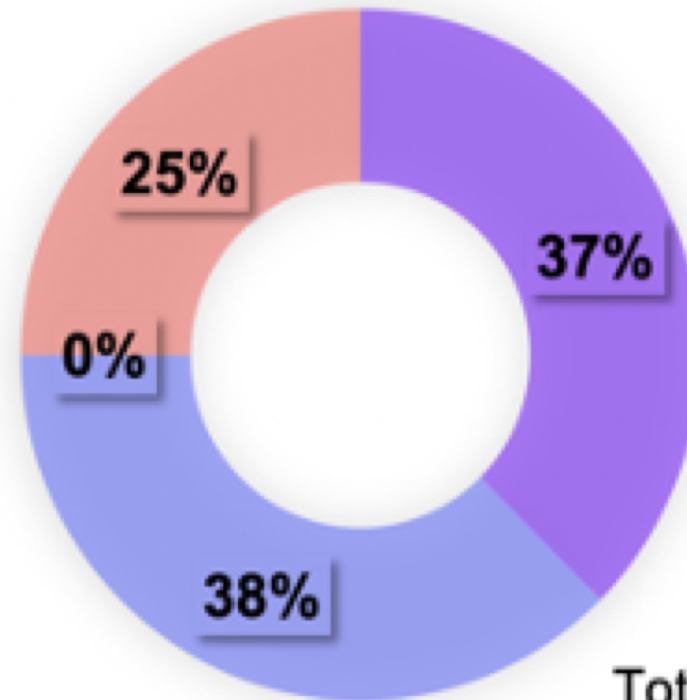
Distribution by Gender and Income Level of Countries



- Half (50%) the CT is women from LMIC
- Women from HIC is 17 % of the CT
- Men from HIC are 12 % of CT
- Men from LMIC is 21% of CT

Total Females: 6

75 % of the Secretariat Members are Women (equal number from HIC and LMIC) and 25 % are Men (all from HIC)

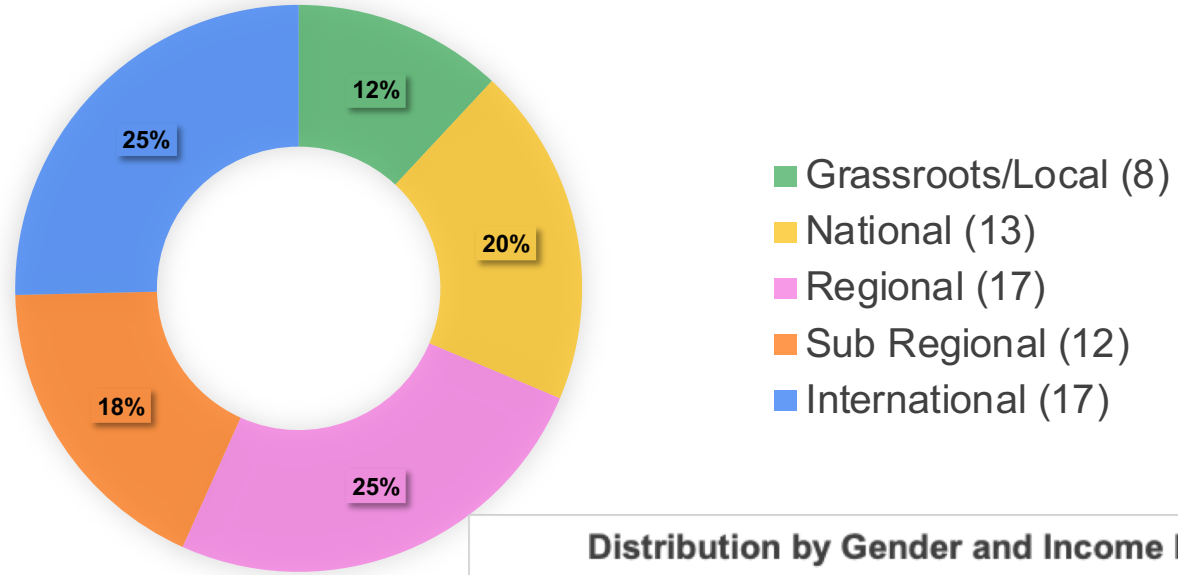

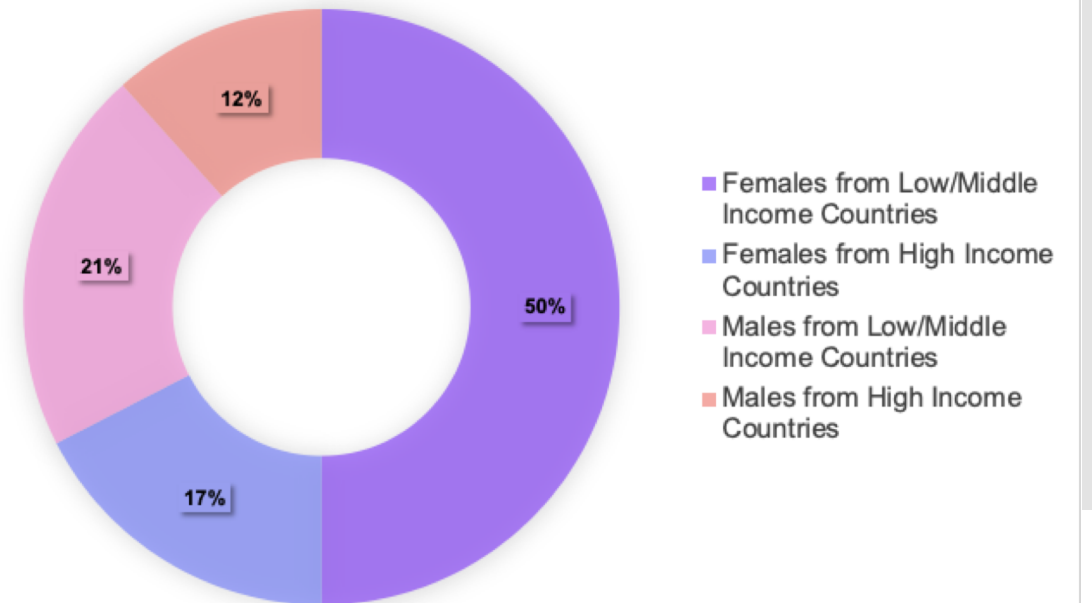
